

Douglas W. Scharre, MD is the Director, Division of Cognitive Neurology, Director of The Ohio State University Center for Cognitive and Memory Disorders, Co-Director of the Neuroscience Research Institute, and Professor of Clinical Neurology and Psychiatry. He is a clinical neuroscience researcher and behavioral neurologist specializing in the diagnosis and management of cognitive issues for over 25 years. He has conducted or participated in over 160 clinical research studies in dementia and mild cognitive impairment, funded by NIH, foundations and industry. He has designed and developed both paper and digital versions of the Self-Administered Gerocognitive Examination (SAGE), a cognitive assessment instrument designed for identifying individuals in a practical way with mild cognitive impairment or early dementia from any cause and to be sensitive to changes over time. Dr. Scharre joined The Ohio State University Wexner Medical Center faculty in the Department of Neurology in 1993. Dr. Scharre is a professor of Clinical Neurology and Psychiatry.
